Disc (frisbee) golf was born in 1974 as a recreational sport for all ages and genders. Disc Golf is played similarly to ball golf, only a frisbee, or disc, is used. The object of the game is to throw the disc into a Disc Pole-Hole, a metal chain and basket target. The winner completes the course in the fewest number of shots.

Rosedale Park will serve as a regional tour stop for the Professional Disc Golf Association, with the highest finishers qualifying for the World Disc Golf Championships in August, 1987 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. The tournament is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, April 25-26, from 10 AM to 5 PM. 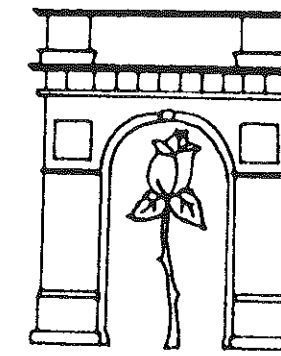
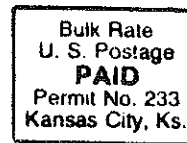

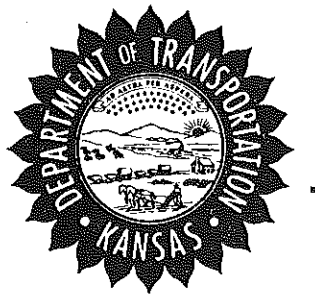
. . .for information leading to the arrest and conviction of persons committing crimes against persons or properties in the Rosedale area.

Dear Ms. Gray:

This will confirm our telephone conversation of March 24, 1987.

The work on I-35 between I-635 and to just north of the bridge over Southwest Blvd began on February 18, 1987. The work will consist of patching, overlaying, addition of a lane, rebuilding the northbound bridge over Mill St. and the widening of the bridges over Roe and Southwest Blvd. This is a preliminary project that will provide for traffic during the actual reconstruction of I-35 at a later date.

To rebuild the northbound bridge over Mill St. it is necessary to carry northbound traffic on two (2) of the southbound lanes through this construction area. The southbound roadway of I-35 at Mill St. will only accommodate four (4) lanes. These four (4) lanes are needed to carry two (2) lanes of northbound and two (2) lanes of southbound traffic. For this reason the on ramp from Southwest Blvd will have to remain closed.

By contract the contractor will be completed with all work by November 15, 1987 and at this time the ramp will be re-opened. If the contractor should complete the work ahead of schedule the ramp will be opened as soon as feasible.

I hope I have addressed all the questions that arose during our conversation. If I can be of further assistance please feel free to call me at any time.

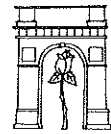

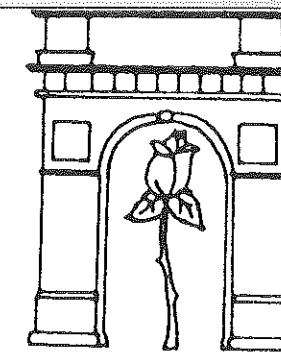

SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM WILL BEGIN IN JUNE

Last summer 4 youths and an adult supervisor worked throughout the Rosedale area to paint houses and clear/mow lots of residents on fixed or low incomes, as well as elderly residents. The Rosedale Development Association will again sponsor this program and needs your input as soon as possible regarding potential recipients of such aid for 1987. All individuals applying for this aid(there is no cost to the property owner who falls within the appropriate income guidelines)will fill out some minimal paperwork which includes income and type of need. The youth workers are all above 16 years of age and may paint whole houses, use electric lawnmowers and other yard equipment at their worksites. Our adult supervisor/foreman goes with these workers to each site and oversees all projects. In addition, we are fortunate to have the services of the same gentleman who held this position before, for the 1987 program.

Cost of this program in salaries, insurance, workman's compensation and materials, receives input through the KCK Community Development Department and a state program called the Job Training Partnership Act. The latter pays and insures youth workers, and each sponsoring agency interviews prospective workers prior to their assignment with that organization. The Association would also appreciate suggestions for any Rosedale area youth from low-moderate income households, who might have interest in this six-week work program.
