REDEDICATION OF THE ROSEDALE MEMORIAL ARCH

On July 20, 1923, over 5,000 people attended groundbreaking ceremonies for the Rosedale Arch, in memorial to soldiers of the 42nd/Rainbow Division who fought during World War I. French war hero and commander of these American troops in France, General Henri Gouraud, turned the first spade of earth. Patriotic bunting lined the streets, French and American patriotic songs filled the air and hundreds of military personnel participated, including 350 troops from Fort Leavenworth.

On Saturday, July 23, 1988 the City of Kansas City Kansas and the Rosedale Development Association will sponsor a rededication of the Arch, recognizing the 65th anniversary of this historic event.

Members of the Rainbow Vets and the French Consulate have pledged their support for our planned activities and will participate to the fullest extent possible.

We plan for this event to be shared by the community and can use any input that individuals or other organizations might have. We wish to include as many veterans of the WWI Rainbow Division as possible, and to incorporate the history of the groundbreaking as an integral part of the 65th Anniversary celebration.

Various operations of Neighborhood Preservation were reassigned to other City Departments and the Community Development Staff was reduced from 19 persons to 12 persons.

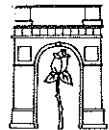

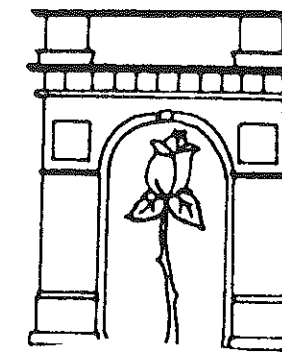
