ROSEDALE HOLDS FIRST DRUG HOUSE PROTEST





Thank you, Thank you, Thank you to everyone who participated in our first drug house protest on Friday, June 3rd. As a result of our protest the landlord has begun eviction proceedings to remove the problem tenants. These tenants were shooting guns, using children on bicycles as couriers and openly selling drugs.

Over 100 people showed up to protest crime, guns, and drugs at an apt. on 42nd and Pearl including Channel 9 News, police officers from KCK and KU, a Missouri neighborhood activist who has closed down 19 drug houses using this method, landlords, apt. managers, and area residents. We had hot dogs and chips for all courtesy of Westwood IGA and free pop courtesy of the KU Police. The kids used sidewalk chalk to decorate the street with anti-drug slogans. An area resident created 12 great protest signs for us and others brought their own signs.

Some of the protesters took a tour of several adjacent blocks noting the other area crime/drug houses. It was a good chance for neighbors to meet other neighbors who are willing to stand up and stand together against crime and drugs.

Our next protest will be July 1st. Everyone will meet at the Frank Rushton School

parking lot at 7pm. We will then go to our chosen site for the evening's protest. This way we will surprise the dealers and kill their business for the evening. Bring a chair and a protest sign if you wish. The police will again be with us.

RDA has begun compiling a list of area residents who do home repair or maintenance work. We are including persons who do lawn care and equipment repair also. The people on our list come with good referrals from other area residents.

We would like to expand our list. If you have had someone work for you who is reasonable and reliable please let us know. On the other hand if you have had a bad experience with a worker or company we would like to know this too.

We believe in supporting local people and businesses as a way of strengthening our community.

RDA Awarded Grant

RDA had just received our first grant. Neighborhood Alliance, a group that serves both Missouri and Kansas by promoting good neighborhoods. awarded RDA a \$2,362 grant. The money is to purchase tools and equipment to clean up and beautify our neighborhoods.

RDA will be assisting elderly. handicapped and low income homeowners with lawn care, gutter cleaning, and minor exterior repair. We will also be cutting and cleaning vacant lots and roadsides utilizing our Court Referred Workers.

We will be able to expand the scope of our project by participating in a summer pilot project with the City. We will be able to hire a supervisor for our court workers and purchase a few more tools. In return we

agree to cut vacant weedy lots in our area for the City. We are cooperating with the Parks Dept. on this project.
