Debris Pick-Up

Collection schedule: Two passes will be made through each neighborhood to pick up debris. The first was scheduled to occur between February 18 and March 18. <u>Preparation of debris</u>. To make sure your debris can be collected, please observe the following guidelines:


- Only broken trees and brush can be picked up.




Burn Permit Process

Residents are allowed to apply for a burn permit at any of the Fire Stations currently staffed by the Kansas City, Kansas Fire Department. The burn permit is valid for up to 3 days during the month of April 2002 and from October 16 through November 15, 2002. Applications must be received and approved at least 24 hours prior to the commencement of burning. Residents shall maintain an adequate water supply and/or fire extinguisher while conducting open burning. In no circumstance shall open burning occur within 15 feet of any building. Piling of brush, tree limbs, grass and other organic materials is limited in size to 100 square feet at the base. Open burning with a permit is allowed between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. At any time, the Fire Chief may revoke burn permits or ban open burning. Weather conditions (high winds, low humidity) may make open burning too dangerous. Open burning may also be suspended when air pollution "Red Alert" days are declared by the Mid America Regional Council, MARC, and the Unified Government. Each Burn Permit allows for one organic pile per permit, one permit per property. All organic materials and/or burning without a permit shall be subjected to Section I-& (General Penalty, Continuing Violations) of the general code of the Unified Government.


