#### Greater Rosedale Community Festival & Uproar Parade





Olympic Graphics International has been in the Rosedale neighborhood about eleven months, but has been in the engraving business for seven years. Company president, Theo Tagtalianidis, spent about five years acquiring the skills necessary to become a master engraver. Rosedale is fortunate to have such talent within our own community, because according to Tagtalianidis, there are only between eighty and one hundred engravers in the country. The increased usage of computers for graphic and other similar work also makes the engraving profession a bit of a fading art, though Tagtalianidis plans for his company to change with the times as necessary. Olympic Graphics International is located at 1324 S.W. Boulevard, just across from the RDA office. The company makes plates out of brass, copper, and magnesium for greeting cards, wedding invitations, brochures and more and provides them to the printers who do the actual embossing. The business' primary clientele is corporations and companies who generally place large orders. One of their largest customers is Hallmark Cards. Other customers include Sunrise Greeting Cards and William House. Tagtalianidis notes close proximity to the highway, other industrial areas, Fed Ex, and UPS services as being attractive qualities about being located in Rosedale. Olympic Graphics International employs two full-time employees and five contract workers. They are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 – 5:00 and can be contacted at 722-2485.

#### Vandalism of the Arch

Early on Saturday morning, November 16<sup>th</sup> a group of young gang-affiliated teens destroyed and damaged numerous parts of the memorial and the area surrounding the Arch. The teens knocked all the globes off of the streetlights in addition to knocking the bulbs and lenses out of the recently installed new lights lining the sidewalk. The teens then apparently crawled over the fence and wrote gang signs, graffiti, and nasty notes of response to a rival Westside, Missouri gang. At the request of RDA and the Hilltop Neighborhood Association, the Parks Department has installed a gate that will be locked nightly. Both RDA and Hilltop are hoping to see the lights repaired in the near future. RDA is continuing to work with KCMO Westside Community Policing Officers to identify the youth involved.

#### Down-Zoning in Frank Rushton

In January, with Wendy's help, the Frank Rushton neighborhood identified that it could benefit from down-zoning a large duplex area to single family. One of the key indicators to long-term sustainability for a healthy neighborhood is home ownership. When ownership goes below 50%, the more transient population is less likely to commit itself to such activities as a crime watch, codes blitz, or neighborhood clean up. This, in turn, opens the door to blight and crime taking hold. The area is enjoying a revitalization, and we felt we could have a greater say in our neighborhood's

plans to build non-single family structures in our neighborhood, the kind least likely to be owner-occupied. Therefore, we followed several steps. First, in February, we built support among the

future if we had an opportunity to review

'regular' members of the association who attend

meetings, and all agreed to make this our project. Then, in March and April, we announced the plan in the newsletter. We also held a special meeting on Monday, April 29th, inviting all the homeowners from the affected area. For this special meeting, we mailed invitations to every owner who lived outside the neighborhood, and we hand delivered to every door inside the affected area, to make sure people received the notice. Throughout this process, Mr. Snodgrass of Catholic Housing, Mr. Speise with UG Planning and Zoning, and Commissioner Mendez joined Wendy in providing technical assistance and expertise to help us develop a plan that would be acceptable both to the neighborhood and the Unified Government. Each of these people attended at least one of our neighborhood meetings to answer questions and help plan. Once this was done, Commissioner Mendez brought a plan from Mr. Speise forward to the Planning and Zoning Commission, and they voted to waive the \$100 per lot fee and consider the proposal on July 29th. After following due process and sending notices, the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the proposal itself on October 21st. While one outside speculator spoke in opposition, the Unified Board of Commissioners recommended the plan for passage. On October 31<sup>st</sup>, the Board of Commissioners unanimously approved the plan sponsored by Mendez. Contributed by Paul Davidson, Co-Facilitator of the Frank Rushton Neighborhood Association





• The Box: Choose a box with enough room for cushioning material around the contents. Sturdy paper-board or corrugated fiberboard boxes are best for weights up

to 10 pounds. If you are reusing a box, cover all previous labels and markings with black marker or adhesive labels.

cushioning all around your item. You can use newspaper, styrofoam "peanuts," bubble wrap or shredded paper. Close and shake the box to see if you have enough cushioning. If you hear items shifting, add more cushioning.

• Sealing: Tape the opening of your box and rein-force all seams with two-inch wide tape. Use clear or brown packaging tape, reinforced packaging tape, or paper tape. # Mapping & Down-Zoning in Hilltop

Several months ago, the idea of conducting a mapping project in the Hilltop area was introduced to the neighborhood association. Professor Helen Hartnett, of KU, came and presented the mapping tool that is intended to assist the neighborhood in monitoring the general condition of their neighborhood, specifically nonresidential property. The neighborhood plans to use the acquired information to see which areas of Hilltop need improvement. An overlay of data indicating which properties are rental properties will also be available. In addition, the Hilltop neighborhood will begin down-zoning in January. The neighborhood is hoping to have more single-family homes in the area and plans to use down-zoning to achieve this goal. We assisted 28 homeowners with minor home repairs and clean ups. RDA addressed 158 codes related issues and boarded up 2 vacant houses. Five individuals looking for housing received assistance through our office. RDA developed a site plan for 76 units of new owner occupied housing in partnership with City Vision Ministries (CVM). We contracted with an architectural firm to develop a 39<sup>th</sup> St. corridor plan with input from the community. RDA developed a plan for infill housing and improvements to existing homes for the 3800 and 3900 blocks of Lloyd. The association worked on

RDA worked in conjunction with youth volunteers and neighborhood members in beautification projects in Belrose. We improved the Rosedale Memorial Arch through the purchase and installation of concrete pads, 3 picnic tables, and 6 benches. In addition, we ordered 7 bollard lights and had brush cleared from rock walls for a total of \$17,189. RDA established the Rosedale historical archives and printed a book with photos of all Rosedale High School graduates from 1886 to 1955. Copies of this work were shared with District 500. All research information was from area residents, as the school district did not have complete records. Wow! What a year it has been. Thank you for your ongoing support of RDA as we seek to continue serving the residents and businesses of the Rosedale community!



# Housing in Hilltop

The Hilltop neighborhood has the most rental properties of all of the Rosedale neighborhoods. A recent mapping project in Hilltop provided an overlay map of rental properties. Hilltop residents in partnership with KU students and staff have been working to collect the data. Some of the findings from the studies revealed that there are 37 duplexes, 87 single family homes, a total of 916 apartments, and 81 buildings that have not been inspected by rental licensing as of August 2002 in Hilltop neighborhood. Two non-conforming rental homes were recently found to have been converted into apartments. Both of these homes are in an area that is zoned for single-family dwellings. Discussion of down-zoning in the Hilltop neighborhood will commence at the January 6<sup>th</sup> neighborhood meeting held at 7 p.m. in the basement of Our Savior Lutheran Church. The 4500 sq. ft. facility will be child-friendly including a corner for playing and eventually for showing children's videos. 

#### **I-35 Ramp Improvements**

Beginning in March of 2003, Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to rework the on and off ramps to I-35 at Mission Rd. The northbound ramp directly next to the fire station on Southwest Blvd. will remain open through this construction phase, but will be closed permanently in 2005. Construction is scheduled to be completed in late August 2003. In 2004, KDOT plans to reconstruct the I-35 and 7<sup>th</sup> St. interchanges. Access to these will be closed for most of the year. In 2005, I-35 construction will reduce traffic to two lanes in both directions beginning at Mission Road to the Missouri line.

#### **UPDATE: TURKEY CREEK**

The US Army Corps of Engineers announces that steps are being taken to wrap up efforts supporting Congressional reauthorization of the current project. A Draft Report and Environmental assessment of the project were completed in August 2002 and the public demonstrated its support of the project by generating

numerous letters. As it stands, the cost of the proposed project totals \$73.4 million, \$45.3 million of which would be federal monies and \$28.1 million of which would be non-federal. It is



projected that coordinated timing of the downstream channel along with the KDOT widening of I-35 will create a sizeable cost reduction for both projects.
