Summer Youth Employment is great opportunity for youth, businesses

ALLING ROSEDALE YOUTH! If vou are a Rosedale resident or attend Rosedale Middle School and are between 14 and 16 years old, and you would like to earn some money this summer as a Summer Youth Employee, please contact the RDA! In addition to gaining solid work experience, you will receive training through the RDA in areas like money management, dealing with different people, job application and interview advice, help with taxes, and work environment behavior. RDA works to place youth in environments where they can explore their personal interests.

Calling all Rosedale businesses! RDA is accepting applications for Summer Youth Employment. The program provides work placement for 14-16 year-olds, giving Rosedale youth valuable employment experience before they officially enter the workforce. The program lasts for 6-8 weeks, and youth typically work around 20 hours/week at their placement. They receive a weekly stipend based on minimum wage, generously provided by a grant from the BPU. The program has now been operating for 13 years, and in that time, many summer youth employees have been so successful that they have received offers of employment at the end of the summer. Against the purpose: litter at the recycling center

Recycling is essential to the environmental health of our community. RockTenn (formerly Smurfit-Stone) contributes to this important work in Rosedale with the Recycling and Waste Center located at 510 Division Street. Unfortunately, design flaws at the RockTenn facility lead to an inexcusable amount of paper escaping from the campus and blowing freely in the neighborhood. Citizens driving on 7th Street past the facility can see litter blowing in the street, accumulating against the trees and

piling up by the railroad tracks. The resulting mess blights surrounding properties and mars an otherwise beautiful part of our neighborhood.

RDA believes that RockTenn needs to either contain the waste within the building, or fence the property in such a way that none of the materials can escape. Although RDA has spoken with the management of the facility, the problem continues. RDA would like to encourage RockTenn to clean up the wayward paper, and to patrol their debris in the future.

Prevent Car Theft

R ECENTLY ROSEDALIANS have seen a rash of car thefts, particularly when an owner has left a car "warming up." Follow these tips to keep your car safe:

- Never leave your car running, even if you'll only be gone a minute. Many vehicles are stolen at convenience stores, gas stations, ATMs, or on cold mornings when the owner leaves the vehicle running to warm up.
- Take your keys. Never leave a second set of keys in your car—it will only take thieves a few minutes to find them.
- Completely close car windows when parking. Don't make it any easier for a thief to enter your car.
- Hide valuables in your locked trunk. Don't make your car a target by leaving your wallet, purse, cell phone, or any other valuables in plain view.
- Don't leave the registration or title in your car. Thieves can use these documents to sell your car. Keep them in a safe place in your home.
- Finally, always pay attention to your surroundings and what is going on. If you see any suspicious activity, call the police. You are the first step in keeping your neighborhood safe!

Bike lanes on their way to Southwest Boulevard/ Merriam Lane

N THE FALL OF THIS YEAR (2012), the Unified Government will begin construction to provide bike lanes on Southwest Boulevard from 10th Street (near Quick's BBQ) to Iowa Street (Strasser Hardware/Holy Name Church). These bike lanes will fall within the existing curb line, so the streets will not be widened. Other improvements include repairs to some of the curbs and sidewalks, a new, smoother asphalt surface, and pavement striping of the bike lanes. Further work will be done to the railroad crossing to make it safer. This portion of the project will cost about \$500,000, of which \$360,000 is a federal grant. Rosedalians can look forward to safer and more pleasant biking and walking along this important corridor.

Late in 2014, the Unified Government will begin a complete reconstruction of Merriam Lane from 10th to 24th Street /Lamar. Reconstruction will feature on-street dedicated bike lanes continued from east of 10th Street, as well as storm water drains, curbs and sidewalks. Design is just beginning for this portion of the work, which will cost \$6.2 million, much of it funded by a federal grant. Public meetings will be held as the project moves forward.



Double homicide reported at Rosedale Ridge

Police were called to the 2100 block of South Mill St. shortly after 2 a.m. on Sunday, March 4, after neighbors heard numerous gunshots. Keith E. Barrett, 21, and Renesha Jones, 16, were killed in the gunfire. An 8-month-old baby was also injured, and was treated and released from the hospital later on Sunday. Barrett was the baby's father, and Jones, the baby's aunt, had been babysitting. Three people were arrested in connection with the killings, and two remain in custody. A vigil was held on Thursday, March 8, at Rosedale Ridge for the victims.

Violence at Rosedale Ridge has been an ongoing problem. RDA is working with the Unified Government, Kansas City Kansas Police Department, social service organizations and residents to try to devise a solution to the problem of violence in the neighborhood. We would like to strongly encourage the property management group at Rosedale Ridge, Yarco, to do the same. We remain committed to building a neighborhood that is safe for all those who live, work and play in Rosedale.

Do YOU WANT FRESH TOMATOES, peppers, and herbs a few steps from your back door? RDA's Healthy Kids Initiative can help you make it happen! Ten home garden kits are available for a minimal cost to families with children in Rosedale. The kits include a 12' x 4' raised bed & soil, garden gloves, hand tools, and a membership to Kansas City Community Gardens (which includes 10 free packets of seeds).

Recipients of a garden kit will participate in gardening workshops throughout the summer, and will have a "garden mentor" who can answer any questions along the way. If you want to bring healthy food to your doorstep and provide a learning experience for your family, contact the RDA office to apply! Preference will be given to families with children who receive free and reduced price lunch. Renters must get landlord's permission to garden. Thanks to the Kansas Health Foundation for providing the funds for this program!

Want to be a garden mentor? Call the RDA and speak to Heidi to volunteer. You must commit to communicating with a family weekly through the summer, and being available for garden questions. English and Spanish speakers needed.

Dynamic Discs

ETE CASHEN, a longtime Rosedale resident. started to dream about opening a disc golf retail location in 2011. Kansas City boasts 21 disc golf courses, with more planned in coming months. Rosedale Park, the city's busiest course, will typically see about 400 games per day in good weather. Cashen saw a strong and growing market for disc golf equipment, and began sharing his dream with Jeremy

Rusco, the owner of Dynamic Discs. On March 9, Dynamic Discs opened their first retail location, at 2854 W 47th Street. The store stocks discs from all major disc golf manufacturers, as well as any other equipment you might need.

Cashen, along with store manager Scott Reek, encourages Rosedalians to

try disc golf. "It's the best decision you'll ever make," says Reek, adding, "Everyone knows everyone. You can walk up to the best player in the world and play a round together." Cashen tells new players "Ask questions! 25 percent of my day on the course is telling someone how to do something." He also invites new players to join the club (Kansas City Flying Disc Club) by coming down to the store and checking out their bulletin board. If you practice, you just might get your name on the "Ace Board," reserved for players who get a hole in one.

Although the heavy traffic at Rosedale Park is a big draw for businesses like

Dynamic, Cashen says "The more I think about it, it's just Rosedale. I've lived here for 24 years. It's affordable, it's a great community for families, it's the historic Rosedale community. In the next ten years, it's really going to take off." Based on the bustling store, Cashen's prediction is a good one. **2**
