On Saturday, May 4, representatives from Rosedale businesses spanning retail. manufacturing, food industry, health services, and more convened at Rosedale Park for the third annual Rosedale Disc de Triomphe. A record 31 businesses sponsored the 2019 tournament, including Dynamic Discs, MKS Pipe & Valve, TMS, Cashen Brothers Inc., University of Kansas Medical Center, West Plaza Tomato Company, and Midtown Signs. Combined, these 31 sponsors raised over \$13,000 in funding to support RDA's work in Rosedale! An additional 24 local businesses provided over \$10,000 in donated items, allowing every single player

Rosedale Farmers Market is open for the season! Join friends and neighbors every Sunday from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. at 4020 Rainbow Blvd. (in the Commerce Bank parking lot) through September 29 and on select Wednesdays from 3:30-5:30 p.m. (June 12 and 26; July 10 and 24; August 7 and 21) at 2100 W. 39th Ave. (in front of KU Health System's Dykes Library).

Fresh eggs, honey, jams, jellies, salsas, baked goods, vegetables, and crafts will make their appearance at the munity gathering space where market this season. Shoppers using SNAP (formerly food stamps) or Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program vouchers receive double value - \$5 in SNAP or SF-NMP equals \$10 in fruits and veggies!

RDA is recruiting neighborhood leaders for the Rosedale Leadership Council (RLC). RLC is a group of Rosedale stakeholders who gather at 5:30 p.m. the third Wednesday of most months in the Koch Community Center at 1401 Southwest Blvd. Some who regularly attend, like Francis Sharon and Bryan Humphrey, are already involved in neighborhood organizations centered around a block or building like Rosedale Towers or Mission Cliffs. Others are simply concerned citizens or parents who wish to participate in the broader community. Many come to learn and a few to discuss issues and seek solutions.

But what each has in common is a deep love for and knowledge of the place they call home. This leads them not only to identify problems affecting their neighbors but also to educate and organize those around them

to advocate for solutions. Together they are building a Rosedale that celebrates diversity, nourishes creativity, supports healthy living, and fosters economic opportunity so more people feel safe and connected and live in quality neighborhoods. Each month's RLC gather-

ing features a different speaker and topic. In May, Commissioner Ann Murguia spoke about her efforts to document and repair post-winter potholes and listened to residents' concerns about the BPU substation being built behind Fisher Park. August's meeting will feature the possible neighborhood impact of KU Medical Center's development plans.
