

Short-Term Rentals, often called vacation rentals or STRs, are furnished living spaces available to rent for a short period of time - typically a few days to a week. In recent years, several STRs have applied to operate in Rosedale (approximately 20 are currently operating), and it's important to understand what they are, what policies govern them, and how they impact a neighborhood.

STRs can be part of a family home, where a family rents out a basement or extra bedroom to vacationers for a little extra income. They also can be a whole house or apartment that a property owner uses as a short-term rental rather than as traditional rental property.

STRs have generated controversy in some cities, including ours. Proponents argue that STRs provide a needed service to visitors, bring tour-
