Bloom Pediatrics and Lactation offers membership model

In the Northwood Shopping Center at 47th and Mission Rd., Dr. Lauren Hughes serves the youngest residents of Kansas City at Bloom Pediatrics and Lactation. Open since 2020 and gaining recent local attention as one of the first practitioners to hold open vaccination clinics in both the fall for the 5-11 age group and this summer for those under 5, Dr. Hughes offers a different approach to medical care and pediatrics that set her apart.

"The American healthcare system isn't intuitive - you often can't see your provider when you are sick and it leads to overall poor medical care and more visits to the E.R. This might be more convenient for the provider but is worse for the patient," Dr. Hughes says. This is why Bloom Pediatrics offers a membership model of care, where patients pay a monthly fee that allows them full access to Dr. Hughes services, including house visits and same or next day sick visits. Membership also includes routine wellness checks and

phone and text access to Dr. Hughes concerning medical needs.

Dr. Hughes is also one of the only MDs who is also a licensed lactation consultant through the IBLCE, and is trained in breastfeeding medicine. She offers her patients lactation support and can help treat and diagnose problems efficiently so that families can focus on feeding.

As a medical professional and mother, Dr. Hughes also encourages all Rosedalians to vaccinate their youth against Covid-19. "I vaccinated my children the moment the vaccinations became available. We are in the middle of a massive surge of new omicron variants and the science is very clear that this is the main protection for kids." Vaccinations are free and offered daily at Bloom Pediatrics.

Welcome to the team, Sarah Oltvedt!



Rosedale Future Professionals returning this fall

Rosedale Future Professionals (RFP) is returning this fall and is currently accepting applications. For those unfamiliar, RFP is a program that focuses on financial literacy for middle school students and teaches youth how to take control of their financial futures. The program started as a means of filling the gap of financial knowledge youth may not get from traditional schooling.

Throughout the six-lesson program students will learn to create a budget, learn the difference between debit and credit, and distinguish the difference between short- and long-term goals, as well as applying these concepts to make a financial plan for their future. Past participants set goals for saving for college,

starting their own businesses, or making major purchases. Students also will receive \$10 for every class they attend.

The program will be held inside the Rosedale schools. and will start on September 12 and last for six weeks, ending in November. 
