Summer program enrollment is coming to a close, apply now!

A reminder to all Rosedale families who are solidifying their summer plans — this is the last call to enroll in Rosedale Development Association's summer programs. All of our applications are online and take less than 15 minutes to fill out, making it easy for you to complete.

We have a few spots left in our Summer Youth Employment program, starting June 6, which is for youth ages 14-17 who are looking for a smooth entry into the workforce. This program provides youth with a variety of professional skills, mentorship from their job site, and job training provided weekly by RDA. Paying \$10 per hour for an average of 15 hours per week, this successful program has prepared hundreds of youth with the tools and confidence they need to both be a good employee and learn their worth in the job market.

Our other main program this summer, the Rainbow Summer Program, also has a few spots available, with a waitlist option once those spots are filled. This literacybased summer program's main focus is to help students retain their reading level throughout the summer, while also giving them handson experience with sports, nutrition, gardening, financial literacy, and advocacy. The program has a registration fee of \$35, with a later activity fee of \$75, and parents

will need to meet in-person with Samanthé, our program director, to fill out additional paperwork.

Our summer programs have participants who come back year after year; youth who become involved in the Rosedale community and whose families become champions of their neighborhoods. We are so excited to continue these programs, and have a summer of fun, learning, and creativity with the incredible youth of Rosedale!

Giving back to the Rosedale community is not only a goal for RDA, but also our passion. The Summer Youth Employment (SYE) program is just one of the ways we invest in Rosedale youth, which in turn creates a stronger community for us all. But this program is larger than RDA – we need the involvement of our local business community. We invite our local businesses to give back by hosting a youth employee this summer!

One of the competencies of our ARCH program, Advancing Rosedale Community Health, is job readiness. To achieve this for our youth, we partner with local businesses to host and mentor them over six weeks during the summer, at no cost to the business. Through grant funding provided by KCBPU, RDA pays youth \$10 an hour for both their work at your business and their additional weekly job readiness training that is provided by RDA throughout the duration of the program.

The connections our youth and businesses establish through this program has led

to job placements once the youth were eligible for full employment. The SYE program is an investment into our future. We are excited to welcome back many of our past participants and new faces this coming summer, and can't wait to see them working, learning, and growing at your local business this year.

House need help? Apply for Christmas in October

Rosedale is full of lovely old homes that have character and charm, with many homes in the area being about 100 years old! Old homes need regular repair and maintenance, but for some Rosedalians who live on a fixed income or are disabled, these repairs are costly and doing it themselves is not an option. RDA wants to help those individuals. We are now accepting applications for our Christmas in October program, which offers minor home repair to qualifying individuals and families at no cost.

To be eligible for the Christmas in October program, the applicant must be a homeowner and own only one residence, the home in which they currently live. They also must lack the finances or resources to complete repairs themselves, cannot have received assistance from Christmas in October in

the past year, and the home cannot be a mobile home. Applicants must also meet one of the following criteria: be aged 62 years or older, have a physical disability at any age, or be a veteran or have a veteran living in the home.

Applications are available online or in our office. Once the application is submitted, RDA will call and follow up with the homeowner, making sure the repairs needed are a good fit for what the program can offer. This usually includes a home visit as well. Then, on October 8, groups of volunteers who are skilled in the areas of plumbing, electric, and carpentry will head to the designated homes and spend all day working on and fixing up the project.

WYCO Residents are eligible for free Covid-19 Resources

Did you know there are a variety of FREE Covid-19 resources available for Wyandotte County residents? One of these no-cost resources is the Covid Assistance Response (CAR) program, which provides home delivery of free food and supply boxes to people who are quarantining or isolating due to a Covid-19 exposure or infection.

The CAR program has been delivering free food and sanitation supplies since the early days of the pandemic, May 2020. To date, CAR has

helped over 4651 households, estimated at 16,647 individuals. 87.94 percent of the deliveries went to people who contracted Covid-19.

Currently anyone living in Wyandotte County who has been exposed to and is isolating/quarantining due to Covid-19 is eligible for free food and Covid relief supplies (cleaning, hygiene, PPE, and medical items) delivered to their doorstep. To submit a request for this assistance, visit wycohelp.org and fill out the food needs request form. If you do not have access to the internet, you may also submit a request by calling 3-1-1, or the Community Heath Council at 913-371-9298.

This program is provided by the Unified Government Public Health Department (UGPHD) and The Community Health Council (CHC) of Wyandotte County, who are committed to supporting the community through the Covid-19 pandemic and beyond.
